  - Snow White
  - Lilac Meadow
  - Diox. Purple
  - Irish Moss
  - Spiced Pumpkin
- Primary Yellow  
Scarlett  
New Leaf
- Neon:**  
Thermal Green  
Scorching yellow  
White Acrylic Paint Pen  
Glamour Dust white glitter

**Brushes:** Stencil or dry brushes,  
Liner, ¼ & ½ flat

Sand & seal surface and basecoat background and sides with Lamp Black.

Apply Stencils:

Trick or Treat: Lilac Meadow

Boo: Snow White

Halloween: Primary Yellow

Candy: Lilac Meadow and Irish Moss

Pumpkins: Spiced Pumpkin

Paint candy corn Primary Yellow

Float ghost Snow White

Paint Snow White checks to “Candy”

Float shade – Diox. Purple at the bottom of ea. letter for “Trick or Treat” and on the inside of the purple letters of “Candy”.

Float highlights of Snow White at the top of the letters for “Trick or Treat”

New Leaf: Float inside green letters of “Candy”.

Scarlett: Float letter of “Halloween” & bottom of candy corn.

Pumpkins: Drybrush centers with Primary Yellow and float shade each section and stem with Scarlett. Eyes, nose and mouth are lamp black with Snow White highlights.

Scorching Yellow – on the candy corns float the middle. Float across the top with Snow White.

Scorching Yellow – float on “Halloween” and add Snow White highlights.

Spider webs are Snow White

Outline “BOO” with Irish Moss

Thermal Green: Here and there on the spider webs, over the green on “BOO”, line across the top of “Trick or Treat” and checks on sides of the surface.

Ghost – Float heavy float of Snow White on the edges and lightly over with Thermal Green.

All white highlights and line work is acrylic paint pen – or line work with Snow White.
